San Diego Residential Lead Abatement Program



Funded as part of a lawsuit settlement, the San Diego Residential Lead Abatement Program (SDRLAP) remediates lead hazards in private residential structures throughout the City of San Diego. Services are conducted, CONFIDENTIALLY, at little or no cost to owners of eligible properties.

DANGERS OF LEAD POISONING

- Childhood lead poisoning is the No. 1
 environmental health problem facing
 children today.
- Deteriorated lead paint is the primary source of childhood lead poisoning. Even small levels of lead in a child's blood can do permanent damage including developmental and behavior problems.
- Childhood lead poisoning is an environmental health problem that causes adverse effects on children's development and later in adulthood. In San Diego County, between 2017 and 2021, 231 children under the age of 6 received services from the San Diego County Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (CLPPP) due to lead poisoning.
- 28% of lead-poisoned people in San Diego live in homes in which lead-based paint or contaminated dust is a possible source.

WHO IS ENCOURAGED TO APPLY FOR THE SDRLAP?

- Housing built prior to 1960.
- Or housing built prior to 1979 with a child less than 6 years of age who lives in, or otherwise frequently visits, who has detectable levels of lead in their blood based on a venous blood draw.
- Or any housing built prior to 1979 with a resident child less than 18 years of age with levels of lead in their blood at or above 5 micrograms per deciliter based on a venous blood draw.
