
Let There Be Light

Directed by John Huston (The Maltese Falcon, The African Queen) as part of his service as an officer in the Army Signal Corps, <u>Let There Be Light</u> depicts the treatment of "psychoneurotics" (now known as post-traumatic stress disorder), through hypnosis, drugs, and psychotherapy.
